Ngiyampaa man and First Nations singer-songwriter Pirritu's (Brett Lee) music is gentle, honest and from the heart. Unusual melodic chords frame this songwriters vocals as they weave around his lyrics like a gentle wind, enticing you into the depths of his personal journey, singing a story of both sadness, love and hope.

Pirritu ('Brett' in Ngiyampaa Language) is proud of his Aboriginality. He strives to connect with family, culture and language. He volunteers with the Ngiyampaa Language Project to test materials as they update Ngiyampaa Grammar written by Tamisin Donaldson in the 1970's.

Pirritu worked as Art Project Officer and sits on the Board of Songlines, Victoria's peak music body for Aboriginal musicians.

In 2019 Pirritu worked on The HOMELANDS Tour, connecting with First Nations artists on their Homelands around Australia and Canada Pirritu's fantastic second album has just been released, entitled "Pirritu: Fire when the Sun Goes Down". He is currently touring a number of regional music festivals in Victoria and NSW, including Cresfest.
