'Wirilda by the Lake' 592-670 Shell Rd, Point Lonsdale

BIRD WATCHING & WALKS HUGELKULTUR TALKS HOT & COLD DRINKS

Bordering Lake Victoria, this remarkable property features old growth original Moonah Woodland, understory plants, the rare Coast Wirilda wattle, a Saw-sedge field, coastal saltmarsh containing a variety of succulent herbs and shrubs, and a growing native seed production business. The planting and farm practices are regenerating the landscape and providing habitat for wildlife.

There are closely mown walking tracks and visitors are encouraged to go for a wander. Beside the lake there is a bird hide where one can rest a while. We have about 20 resident bird species, but in the shed a list names 111 different birds that have been spotted above, or on, the farm.

West of the farm shed is a fenced vegetable garden of Hugelkultur construction.. this method creates a self-sustaining garden bed that retains moisture like a sponge.

An indigenous front garden and informal rear



garden of flowering annuals are intermingled with succulents and hardy perennials. The result is a drought-tolerant garden Mia describes as 'survival of the fittest', the garden thriving without watering. New discoveries are made every turn, with sunken gardens and hidden walkways dotted with

ornaments and artworks Mia has created.

Productive plants in raised vegetable plots, a cubby house and an enchanting fairy garden are fluently blended into the space. SWAN BAY ENVIRONMENT ASSOC. PLANT STALL & INFO. COFFEE. TEA & SLICES

The block comprises two homes with a shared indigenous and productive garden. There is no lawn. Instead, there are establishing plantings of local grasses, shrub, trees and wildflowers. A pond was installed 18 months ago and has become a magnet for insects, birds and frogs. The aim is to provide food and shelter for both humans and animals, an engaging endeavour for all concerned.

The Queenscliffe Indigenous Nursery will have a small plant stall and visitors can learn about the work of the Swan Bay Environment Association and their local Gardens for Wildlife programme.

DEVONSHIRE TEAS



Set amongst vineyards with views across Swan Bay and The Rip. this lovely homestead was built in 1887 by James Wilson. Wilson was the owner and trainer of Briseis, the only horse to win the Victoria Derby, Melbourne Cup and Oaks in the one week – 1876. The Historic Stables, now an events space, are open to wander as part of your garden experience. Expansive green lawns lead out from the Stables and across to the Cottages which are adorned by climbing roses. The Homestead, surrounded by a classic wide wooden veranda overlooking Swan Bay and Port Phillip Bay, is set in a formal garden with clipped hedges, vast lawns and mature trees. Pathways lead to beds filled with flowers, the original mistress's cottage, cricket field and orchard. At the back of the homestead, mass planted Euphorbias frame the Conservatory.

Follow the Echium Candicans (Pride of Madeira) into the Conference Centre where Devonshire Tea will be served (10am-3pm).
